

## **Program Summary**

#### Strengths

- Wide variety of CTE programs are offered across AVUSD. More than half of the student population (53%) participate in these programs.
- Students completing 300 hours or more of CTE training in their selected pathway went up from 276 in the previous school year to 379.
- Increase in students receiving college credit while still in high school from their CTE pathway and articulation with the local community colleges from 811 in 2021-22 to 1,051 in 2022-23
- Graduation rates for CTE completers continues to outpace the overall state averages. AVUSD CTE graduation rate = 98.9%
- Increased the number of students participating in a non-traditional program from 57 to 124
- Increased the number of options of available to certifications as well as the number of students receiving Industry-recognized certifications

- Improve Academic Proficiencies in CTE students (reading, math and science test scores are down from previous years.)
- Continue to serve the community with dignity by meeting the academic, behavioral and social- emotional needs of all students so they may thrive in an ever-changing world.
- Continue to provide more CTE offerings and opportunities for students in subpopulation groups that allow them to earn Industry-recognized assessments, certificates and certifications.
- Continue to provide specific outreach to our special populations within CTE Programs
- Continue to focus on engaging and High Quality CTE curriculum and industry standard equipment for all CTE classrooms



### **Program Summary**

#### **Strengths**

- •Barstow High School **CCI Dashboard** score was at **80.3%**, largely represented by CTE completers. **CTE completers** represent **57% of graduates** (2022-2023). Course refinements within CTE have augmented A-G completion as well as CTE completion rates.
- •BHS **counseling team prioritizes pathway completion** as evidenced by completion data (n=168). Of completers, 39% were double pathway completers and 11% were triple pathway completers.
- •Data systems and teams are in place to unify efforts toward common goals (Dashboard Focus Team 2023-24).

- •Analyze dashboard with lens on subpopulation data to determine intervention opportunities in core academic areas. Target goals have not been met for Language Arts (34%), Mathematics (7%), or Science (10%) and continue **Training on data** (collection and meaning) for all stakeholders. Teachers would benefit from this to assist them in understanding success criteria.
- •Reimagine post-secondary opportunities for CTE courses. A 25% increase across all sub-population data for both credits and credentials indicate that students are prepared for more rigorous opportunities within sector studies.
- •Work-based learning opportunities need defined and aligned to school needs and culture. There is no tracking mechanism in place.



- 4% increase in ELA Proficiency (11% SWD, 23% Non-Trad)
- 40% of CTE Graduates report enrollment in formal post-secondary training
- Over 1,600 students received college credit through their CTE pathway.
- Positive trend of CTE Completers #54 (2019), #403 (2022), #519 (2023), and 600 projected for 2024 grads
- New Pathway options 27 total (2023) 2 new in Education and ICT.
- All HUSD pathways are aligned to regional priority sectors with adequate employment opportunities. Pathway offerings in the areas of ICT and Education expanded over 2023.







2022-23 CTE Enrollment by Course Level



#### Strengths

- Two New Agriculture Teachers, Scott Laffin Agriculture
   Construction (Intro to Ag Mechanics) and Briana Tluczek, Animal
   Science: Vet Tech; growth to a four-person department
- Agriculture Enrollment: From 328 in 22-23 requested agriculture to 479 students in 23-24 requested agriculture, growth addresses gaps and benefits sub pops, all pops.
- Entire CTE: Our industry recognized credentials increase from 399 to 733, up 83.7%
- **FFA**: participated in 50+ events for the 23-24 school year; 28 students attending the State FFA Convention.
- SkillsUSA: 38 students going to SkillsUSA State Competition; 78 students participated in SkillsUSA regionally, in 2021 SHS had nine students compete regionally

- Articulation: Even though Serrano CTE is above the 90% agreed-upon target for post-secondary credits by 44%, the goal is to work with RCC to increase articulation credit opportunities for CTE students.
- WBL: Expand our (WBL) experiences for CTE students;
- State Test Scores: Increase Serrano CTE math and science academic proficiency scores, as both are below the 90% agreed-upon target, particularly math, which is 12% below the target
- Continue to work on strategies to increase the accuracy and understanding of data collection, reporting and processes for all district staff including new staff and instructors.








