

#### **ABOUT HUSD**

Hesperia Unified School District serves the City of Hesperia and adjacent areas in the High Desert of San Bernardino County and covers 140 square miles. HUSD provides public education services for over 23,000 pre-kindergarten through senior high school students, as well as adult education. It includes 3 comprehensive high schools, 2 alternative high schools, 3 middle schools, 15 elementary schools, 1 independent study school, and 1 career and adult education center. HUSD is the region's largest employer with over 2,500 employees.

#### **Academic Excellence**

Hesperia Unified School District strives to prepare students for success in college and career, provide a physically and emotionally safe learning environment, and engage our parents, families, and community members as partners in the education of all students. Our vision is to accomplish this through a guaranteed and viable curriculum with coherent instructional practices that develop deep literacy through the 6 Cs and innovation. Based on research identifying the skills employers need the most, the following global competencies, the 6 Cs, describe the skills we desire for our students' success:

**Critical Thinking**: the ability to problem-solve at high levels

**Collaboration**: the ability to work interdependently as a team

Communication: the ability to articulate clearly

for purpose and impact

**Creativity**: the ability to turn ideas into action **Character**: the ability to act with empathy,

compassion and integrity

**Citizenship**: the ability to solve complex realworld problems to benefit the community

## **Student Well-Being**

Integrated throughout our programs are lessons and structures to support students in developing resiliency and a healthy lifestyle. Hesperia Unified has developed a Health and Wellness Framework that serves as a model for our region. A majority of our staff has been trained in Youth Mental Health First Aid. We have added counselors at the elementary level and increased counseling support at the secondary. Our goal is to provide all students with the supports they need to be successful.

## **College and Career**

Throughout our district, we are focused on providing high quality and rigorous instruction that incorporates the global competencies to best prepare our students for success whether they choose to go on to college, a trade school, serve in the military or join the workforce, Almost 50% of our 2022-23 graduates fulfilled A-G requirements, the rigorous requirements for UC or Cal State acceptance, 28% were accepted into a fouryear university and 52% moved on to a community college. Our students earned over 10,000 college credits last year while they were in high school through dual enrollment and articulated classes. Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) has provided support in our district to underrepresented and first-generation college students since 1997.



Our Career Technical Education pathways, many of which coordinate with programs at Victor Valley College, include auto, medical, welding, manufacturing, dental, cyber security, computer technology, culinary, construction technology, and more.

## **Family & Community Engagement**


Parents are involved in School Site Councils,
English Learner Advisory Committees, the
District Advisory Committee, the District English
Learner Advisory Committee, the AfricanAmerican Parent Advisory Committee, and many
additional outreach efforts. Students, in addition
to student leadership classes and councils, take
part in surveys and Student Voice dialogue
sessions. HUSD recently emphasized the
importance of parent involvement by creating
parent liaison positions at every school site.

HUSD has its own social worker and a Family Resource Center to provide support and resources to our families. HUSD has also received a Community Schools grant, working with community partners such as IEHP, Providence-St. Mary, and the High Desert Children's Center to provide health and wellness services to our students and community.

## Safety

Safety is a top priority. Each school site develops a safe school plan that is reviewed each year. In addition, Hesperia Unified has a post-certified police department with an officer housed at every secondary school and also serving the elementary schools in that region.
